Check-out Rounds – Home: Dismissed by Attending when daily work is completed.

How Should Residents Relate to Students?

How is dictation of notes handled?

Teaching Methods

Morning Report, Attending Rounds, Noon Conference, Journal Club, Grand Rounds, Patient Safety Conference, Direct Patient Care, Clinical Review, Mini CEX

Assessment Method (Residents)

1. **All Competencies** - Evaluation completed by the teaching faculty.
2. **All Competencies** - Evaluation completed by peers on the rotation.
3. **All Competencies** - Evaluation completed by the teaching faculty on a presentation by the resident
4. **Medical Knowledge** - Evaluation of medical knowledge exam

Assessment Method (Rotation)

1. A rotation evaluation completed by the resident, detailing their experience on the rotation.

Assessment Method (Attending Physician)

1. Attending Physician evaluation completed by the resident, detailing their experience with the Attending.

Teaching Format/Lectures:

Attending physicians will prepare and present 4 lectures a month

Residents will prepare and present 4 lectures a month (the attending physician will assign the lectures to the residents)

Residents will take a medical knowledge test.

Attending physicians will review EKG's with residents
