**Where Do Residents Report the First Day of the Month?**

- 9:00 am on the first day of the rotation.
- Attending will page resident and advise where to meet.
- Contact the resident on Rheumatology the month prior to your rotation to obtain patient list.
- Resident required to stay each day until 5:00 pm, or until patient care duties are completed

**Arrival:** Pre-round on all patients before Morning Report

**Morning Report:** 8:00 – 8:45 am

**Rounds (with Bedside Teaching):** 9:00 – 10:00 am

**Noon Conference:** Noon – 1:00 pm

**Patient Care/Teaching/Clinic:**

- See consults and work-up new admissions
- Afternoon Clinic any afternoon during the week
- Didactic Lecture every Wednesday – 8:00 am – 9:00 am
- Rheumatology Clinic with Dr. Amr Edrees (located in Gray Clinic/Truman Medical Center) Tuesday and Thursday afternoons (as long as resident is not in continuity clinic)

**Service Format (continued):**

- Musculoskeletal Injection Clinic (located in Red Clinic/Truman Medical Center One Monday afternoon per month – you will be notified of the date)
- **Check-out Rounds – Home:** 5:00 pm or until patient care duties are completed

**How Should Residents Relate to Students?****General:**

- Residents should write their own notes on the patients seen by medical students.
- **Residents should not incorporate any student notes into their own work.**
- Residents should be a resource for education and direction.
- Residents should provide opportunities for observation and teaching of procedures.
- **Students are not allowed to dictate on behalf of any physician.**

**Rotation Specific:**

- Residents should assign students 1-2 patients

**Teaching Methods**

Morning Report, Attending Rounds, Noon Conference, Journal Club, Grand Rounds, Patient Safety Conference, Direct Patient Care, Clinical Review, Mini CEX, Attending Lectures.

**Assessment Method (Residents)**

1. **All Competencies** - Evaluation completed by the teaching faculty.
2. **All Competencies** - Evaluation completed by peers on the rotation.
3. **Patient Care** - Mini CEX (*Proper Musculoskeletal Exam*) completed by the teaching faculty.
4. **Medical Knowledge** - Topic Check off Card

**Assessment Method (Rotation)**

1. A rotation evaluation completed by the resident, detailing their experience on the rotation.

**Assessment Method (Attending Physician)**

1. Attending Physician evaluation completed by the resident, detailing their experience with the Attending.

**Educational Resources****Core Rheumatology Topics Card**

- The topics will be checked off by the Attending Physician as they are discussed with the resident.
- The Attending Physician signs off on the card at the end of the month. Successful completion of this card is required for the rotation
